

Welcome to Mount Hope Farm

You are invited to share in the beauty of the 127 acre estate. As you walk the grounds, you will see the following buildings:

THE GOVERNOR BRADFORD HOUSE

Built by Isaac Royall in 1745 and added to in 1840, 1890, and 1935, this house is a rare and one-of-a-kind Colonial with original furniture, panelling and four fireplaced bedrooms. The house currently serves as a four room B&B.

THE BARN

This 19th century structure affords 17 foot ceilings and a panoramic view of Mount Hope and Narragansett Bay from the cupola. The Barn currently serves as an event facility for Mount Hope Farm.

THE PLANHOUSE

Carpenters at the Herreshoff Manufacturing Company built the Planhouse in the 1930s. The structure imitates the roof and corners of the main house.

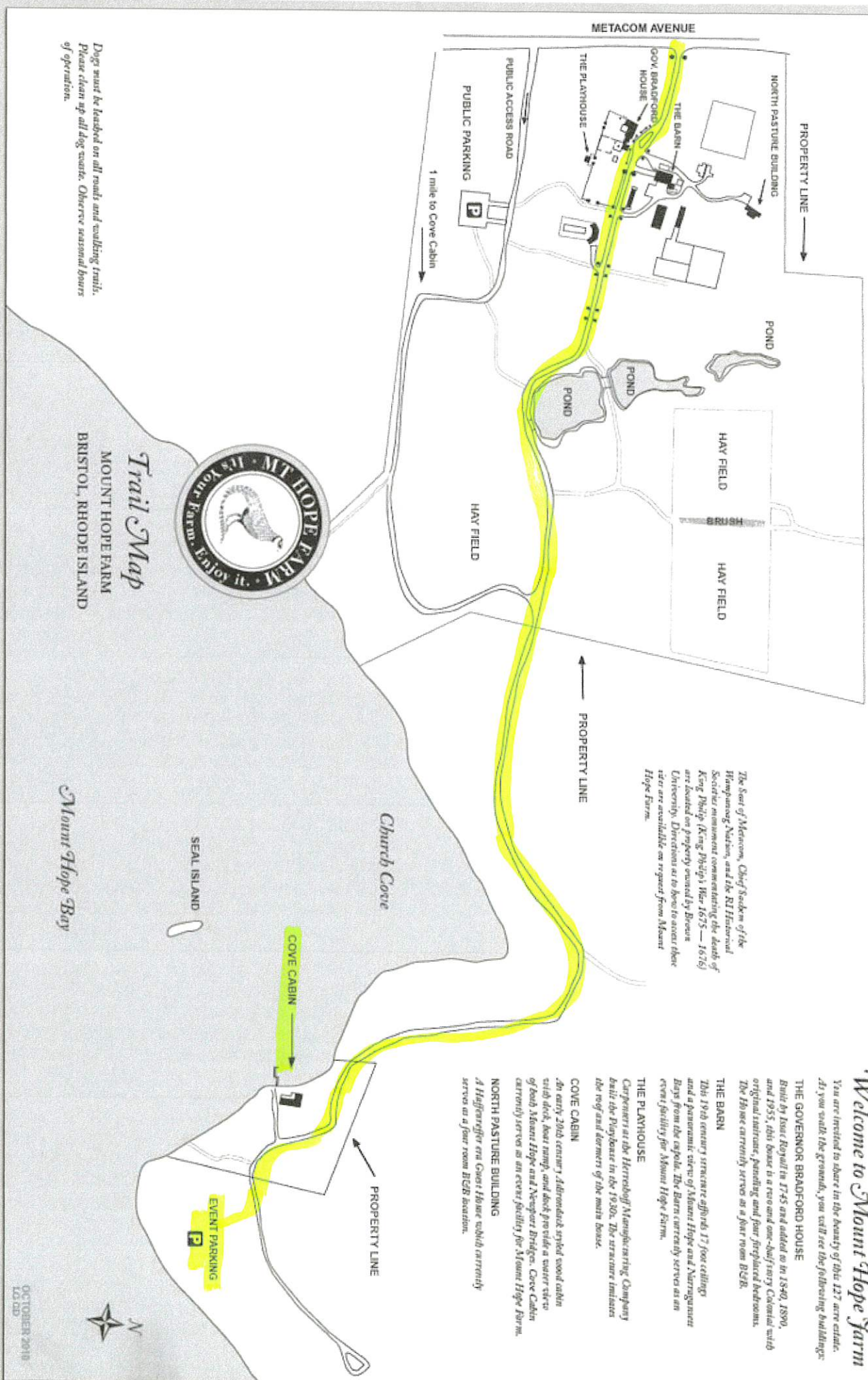
COVE CABIN

An early 20th century Adirondack style wood cabin with deck, boat ramp, and dock provide a water view of both Mount Hope and Newport Bridges. Cove Cabin currently serves as an event facility for Mount Hope Farm.

NORTH PASTURE BUILDING

A Haggenaffler era Coast House which currently serves as a four room B&B location.

The Seat of Metacom, Chief Sachem of the Hingham, Mattabesett, and the RI Historical Societies monument commemorating the death of King Philip (King Philip's War 1675 — 1676) are located on property owned by Brown University. Directions as to how to view these sites are available on request from Mount Hope Farm.
